The original song by Charles King has a different melody and slightly different lyrics (including additional verses; see King's *Book of Hawaiian Melodies*, p. 88). The version commonly sung today was made popular by Andy Cummings. This song was adopted as a theme song for the 442nd unit during WWII. 

About the Composer:

The man who wrote 'White Sandy Beach of Hawai'i' was actually from Vietnam. Willie Dann was a mystery. His song had been a staple of Hawaiian music for many years. But there was nothing on file saying who Willie Dann actually was. He hadn't written any other songs that they could find. There was no address for him, so his royalties were kept on the side for many years in case he should show up.

In 2005, 12 years after the album was released, the record company got a call from a Vietnamese guy, called Duc Huy, claiming he had written the song, and that Willie Dann was a stage name. He'd married in Waikīkī and wrote the song after a walk along the beach with his wife. Now in L.A. after breaking up with his wife and looking to start a new life, he decided to see if the song he had written years earlier was worth anything.

He was given a royalty check for \$50.000, and receives royalties in Vietnam every three months – L.A. hadn't worked out.
