



The original song by Charles King has a different melody and slightly different lyrics (including additional verses; see King's *Book of Hawaiian Melodies*, p. 88). The version commonly sung today was made popular by Andy Cummings. This song was adopted as a theme song for the 442<sup>nd</sup> unit during WWII.
