Based on an old chant, this song is ostensibly about the goby fish. However, since ancient times this fish has been used in chants as a metaphor for sexual activity. A distinctive characteristic of the `o`opu nui (big goby) is that its tail sticks up prominently while feeding. Kamakahi fondly recalls an old swimming hole in his home area (Aliamanu on O`ahu). In the liner notes for *Hui Aloha*, he refers to this song as a “tale of rising water”—at least partly due to the fact that the swimming hole only existed after heavy rains, but the comment could also allude to *kaona* (subtext). The lantana flower (*lākana* in Hawaiian) is not native to Hawai`i, and may give a clue as to who this song was composed for or about. Moanalua Golf Course now covers this area.
